The letters that remain unused form a sentance from left to right. 'AI POHAKU - To eat the stones, a phrase used by Hawaiians who were loyal to the Kingdom. ALI'I - Chief, King or Queen, Royal ALOHA 'AINA - To love the land. AUPUNI - Kingdom or government. COUP - The illegal seizure of power from a government. HO'OULU LĀHUI - The growing of a nation. **INDEPENDENCE** - Freedom for self-governance. 'IOLANI - The sacred hawk and name of the Palace. KAPU - Sacred, forbidden, KŪ'Ē - To oppose, resist, or protest. KULEANA - Responsibility, right, and privilege. KŪ'OKO'A - Independence, liberty. KU'U HAE ALOHA - My beloved flag, the Hawaiian flag. LILI'UOKALANI - The last Queen of Hawai'i. MAI POINA - Do not forget, always remember. MANA - Spiritual and divine power. ONIPA'A - Steadfast, the motto of Queen Lili'uokalani. **OVERTHROWN** - To remove forcibly from power. PAOAKALANI - One of the Queen's homes and gardens in Waikīkī. PALACE - Name 'Iolani, the home of the Kings and Queens of Hawai'i. QUILTED - The Queen worked on a beautiful quilt during her eightmonth imprisonment in an upstairs bedroom of the Palace. ULUHAIMALAMA - Another of the Queen's gardens in Nu'uanu. Flowers were brought to her from these gardens while she was imprisoned. The flowers were wrapped in Hawaiian newspapers so that the Queen could learn what was happening to her people. This inspired her to write the song Ku'u Pua I Paoakalani, praising her beloved people.
