'A'ALI'I - a shrub with small colorful flowers, made into wili style lei 'ĀKULIKULI - succulent plant flower with bright colors 'AWAPUHI - ginger flower HAKU - a lei style: a three-strand braid using at least two types of flowers HALA - fruit of the pandanus tree, made into kui style lei HILI - a lei style: a braid using the same type of material like kauna'oa HILO - a lei style: twisting or braided HINAHINA - a silver air plant representing Kahoʻolawe HĪPU'U - a lie style: knotting the stems together HUMUPAPA - a lei style: to sew materials to a backing, like feathers to hat lei 'ILIMA - yellow and orange flowers representing O'ahu KAUNA'OA - orange, leafless vine representing Lāna'i KOKI'O - native Hawaiian hibiscus with red or white flowers KUI - a lei style: to string flowers together using a needle and thread LAU KĪ - ti leaf LOKELANI - pink rose representing Maui MAILE - beautifully scented twining shrub MOKIHANA - small scented green fruits representing Kaua'i NĀNŪ - native species of gardenia 'OHIA LEHUA - the flower of the 'ohia tree 'OLAPA - tree with leaves that flash like lightning, made into hipu'u style lei PAKALANA - Chinese violet, yellowish-green flowers with a beautiful scent PALAPALAI - native fern with lacy green fronds **PĀ'ŪOHI'IAKA** - beach vine with pale blue or white flowers

**PĪKAKE** - Arabian jasmine, a favorite lei of Princess Ka'iulani

**PUAKOU** - orange tubular flowers from the kou tree, made into kui style lei **PUAMELIA** - plumeria flowers

PUAKENIKENI - white, yellow, and orange sweet flowers

PŪPŪ NI'IHAU - tiny, precious sea shells from Ni'ihau

WILI - a lei style: to bind materials to a base by winding them with twine
